

**Exhibit (80). State Attorney Investigative Report, Matt Simpson, the Carsmetics, Inc.,
Employee who cleaned Rita Nordmark's car 9/04/01, two days after Shawn's death;04/19/02:**

Matt Simpson said Rita Nordmark brought the car to him on Tuesday, (two days after Shawn's death) and told him she was driving on U.S. Hwy 19 with her best friend when the gun went off and she pulled over to the side of the road. She never mentioned being at the Helen Ellis Hospital. Mr. Simpson said Rita Nordmark told him that she and someone else (Patricia Nordmark), had been cleaning and scrubbing the car with Oxyclean for two full days but could not get all of the blood stains out. She told Mr. Simpson she had cleaned it at least ten times. Mr. Simpson said he spent more than four and a half hours scrubbing the car with soap and water and with a large amount of paint thinner. He said he completely cleaned the entire car and stated that the windows had already been thoroughly scrubbed clean and shined when Rita Nordmark brought the car. Mr. Simpson also stated that there was a spray of blood on the ceiling/head liner above and behind the driver's seat sprayed out in an 8-10 inch circumference. He also said there was a large spot of blood on the back passenger side sail panel as if Shawn's head had rested there.

I told Steve Porter, the State Attorney Investigator about this information and I also told him that Mr. Simpson was afraid of speaking with prosecutors and being involved with subpoenas etc., because of a DUI manslaughter charge involving the death of his best friend for which he served time in his past. I asked Mr. Porter not to subpoena him but to visit and try to speak with him in a non threatening manner as I felt Mr. Simpson wanted to help but was afraid of the police and prosecutors. Unfortunately, I was later told that Mr. Porter allegedly walked in, immediately informed Mr. Simpson he had investigated and performed a background check on him and then recited a litany of past charges and accusations against this man. As could reasonably be expected, Mr. Simpson was extremely intimidated by the State Attorney Investigator, became defensive and fearful and was no longer willing to cooperate in any way. Investigator, Steve Porter identified him as a hostile witness in his investigative report and was told by Mr. Simpson that if he is subpoenaed for Court he will deny ever having seen the Nordmark's vehicle (**Ex. 80**). After finishing his business with Mr. Simpson, Mr. Porter proceeded to the British Pub where he informed Rita Nordmark as to Mr. Simpson's comments regarding blood on the headliner in her car (**Ex. 67**). Obviously, if the headliner had not been replaced by that time, it likely was quickly disposed of and replaced immediately after Mr. Porter's very informative visit.

On April 18, 2002 Investigator Steve Porter was contacted by Matthew Simpson, white male, date of birth 08/09/66, work telephone number 727-789-0300. Simpson was the co-manager and detailer at Carsmetics located at 24316 U.S. Highway 19 N., Palm Harbor, Florida. Simpson recalled Rita Nordmark having brought her vehicle, 1996 Honda Civic to his business to remove blood and the foul odor from the rear passenger seat. Simpson described a circular stain pattern on the rear passenger seat behind the driver's seat. Simpson states he also noticed two spots the size of a pinhead on the headliner somewhere in the area above the center console. Simpson was not certain if these spots were blood indicating it was a long time ago and he just

recalled wiping clean the two spots. Simpson advised he was not asked to clean the headliner. Simpson advised that Rita Nordmark paid cash and that service tickets are only kept two weeks and then are destroyed.

Simpson is a hostile witness due to having been prosecuted by this office in the past for D.U.I. Manslaughter/Violation of Probation and was sentenced to the Department of Corrections for five years. Simpson states if he is subpoenaed for court he will deny ever having seen Nordmark's vehicle and further refused to provide a current address or telephone number other than his work telephone number.
